

Historian, Scholar Journalist and Author, born in New Canton, Virginia. Known as the "Father of Black History," he founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History in 1915. His most popular book, published in 1933, is the "Mis-Education of the Negro." He is perhaps, best known for creating, what is known today, as Black History Month, in 1926.






visitest him?" Friends, think

# MR. LARRY CALLIES, FOUNDER-CURATOR OF,

name Callies. was born in El Campo, TX in 1952. I was raised in Boling, I am a Christian first and a Cowboy second. Each of these identities

helped me uncover pieces of my heritage. I worked on a ranch in Hungerford, TX, as a young man. Many of my dreams began there on that ranch. I learn to play country music. George Strait's manager was once my manager. I lost my voice in the 1990's and ost my manager. I worked for the United State Post Office for 34 years and then retired in 2010. I then went to work at The George Ranch Historical Park. That is where I began working with leather and did

eenactments of cowboys of the 1800's. In 2014, I was on Channel 26 News, Houston, TX, talking about opening a Black Cowboy Museum. Naomi Mitchell Carrier saw me on the news and contacted me. She wanted to donate an 1850's southern, slave house. As soon as I heard the Mitchell "name", I knew she was a relative. Because that is how God works. I asked Miss Carrier where did her relatives come from.

She told me they were from Hallettsville, TX. I told her that is where my mother was from and Mom was a Mitchell. She said there was a slave owner by the name of Capt. Isaac Newton Mitchell who had children by his slaves and they would be given the Mitchell name. I ask Miss Carrier how did she know this. She said you can look it up on the internet. I ooked up a Texas Family by the name of James Kerr Crain, 1957. I looked it up and printed a 22 page write up. I was reading it at my Saddle Shop one day and my cousin Dwight Callies, from Edna, TX, walked in the shop. This is how God works. He asked me what I was reading; so, I showed him it was about my great-great grandfather from Hallettsville, TX. He

told me I should read about the first slave owner Major James Kerr from Edna, TX. Dwight said that's your grandfather also from my father's side. I asked him how did he know this. He said all the Callies came from that Kerr Plantation in Edna, TX. Major James Kerr was the Plantation owner and a minister of the Gospel. He had children with his slaves and kept a record of all the slaves he had children with. Major Kerr kept this in his Bible. He had them listed with the year and day they were born. I called my Uncle Willie Callies from El Campo, TX. He was 94 years old; he was born in June 1919. I asked Uncle Willie how far can he go back in history. Uncle Willie whispered on the phone we have a white grandma. I then asked if he remembered her name. He said her name was Sally, but her real name was Annis. In Major Kerr's Bible, she was the 2nd child out of 12 Annis was born March 1838. This is how God works in my life. If my cousin had not walked in at the time I was reading that article, or Miss Carrier had not

seen me on TV; I would never had known any of this family history. When I worked at the George Ranch a young girl took a picture of me on a horse and then made a drawing of the picture. She entered the drawing of me on the horse into the Houston Live Stock Show. She won First Place! The First Prize portrait went for \$205,000. They also sold 3,200 copies for \$300 apiece.

Museum in Rosenberg, TX, because Fort Bend County is where the first cowboys came from. The name "cowboy" came from slaves. The owners of slaves had a "house boy", a "yard boy"; and someone who worked the cows, he was called a "cowboy". This is history and that is what I'm trying to preserve.
