HOW WILL SANCTITY OF HUMAN LIFE SUNDAY BE CELEBRATED IN JANUARY 2026?

THE HISTORY OF SANCTITY OF HUMAN LIFE SUNDAY

President Ronald Reagan issued a presidential proclamation on January 13, 1984, designating Sunday, January 22, 1984 as National Sanctity of Human Life Day, noting that it was the 11th anniversary of Roe v. Wade, in which the Supreme Court issued a ruling that guaranteed women access to abortion.^[1] President Reagan was a strong anti-abortion advocate who said that in Roe v. Wade the Supreme Court "struck down our laws protecting the lives of unborn children".^[2]

Reagan issued the proclamation annually thereafter, designating Sanctity of Human Life Day to be the closest Sunday to the original January 22 date.^[3] His successor, George H. W. Bush, continued the annual proclamation throughout his presidency.^[4] Bush's successor, Bill Clinton, discontinued the practice throughout his eight years in office, but Bush's son and Clinton's successor, George W. Bush, resumed the proclamation and did so every year of his presidency.^[5]

Sanctity of Human Life Sunday (SOHLS) will primarily be celebrated on January 18, 2026, which is the third Sunday of the month. While the official national day is Thursday, January 22, 2026, most churches observe the occasion on the surrounding Sundays (January 18 or January 25).

Churches and pro-life organizations will celebrate through the following activities:

Church Services and Spiritual Observances

- Special Sermons: Pastors use this day to preach on the biblical value of life from conception to natural death.
- Prayer and Reflection: Congregations will hold prayer

vigils to mourn lives lost to abortion and pray for families, pregnant women, and the pro-life movement.

- Masses and Processions: The Catholic Church will observe a Respect Life Mass on January 18 and a pro-life rosary procession on January 17.

- Educational Videos: Many churches show training or testimony videos during services to explain the impact of abortion and promote a "culture of life".

- Community Support and Fundraising

- Pregnancy Center Partnerships: Churches often invite representatives from local pregnancy centers to speak or set up displays to raise awareness for their services.

- Baby Bottle Boomerang: A common fundraiser where congregants fill baby bottles with change or donations to support local life-affirming ministries.

- Donation Drives: Collecting essential items for newborns and mothers, such as formula, baby clothes, cribs, and blankets.

- March for Life: The national March for Life in Washington, D.C., is scheduled for Friday, January 23, 2026.

- 9 Days for Life: A novena of prayer and action organized by U.S. bishops, running from January 16 to January 24, 2026.


- Local Marches: Communities may host smaller "mini-marches" or prayer walks to local facilities at the end of the month.

THEMES AND RESOURCES

- Lutherans For Life has designated the 2026 theme as "Fearfully and Wonderfully Made".
- Baptist and Anglican organizations provide specific preaching guides, bulletin inserts, and Sunday School lesson plans titled "Imago Dei" (Image of God).



all Americans to volunteer to improve their communities.

Americans celebrated the first official Martin Luther King Day, which is the only federal holiday commemorating an African American, on Monday, January 20, 1986. In 1994, Congress designated the holiday as a National Day of Service and marking the third Monday in

January every year as the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service - a "Day On, Not a Day Off."

King was awarded at least fifty honorary degrees from colleges and universities.^[303] On October 14, 1964, King became the youngest recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize, which was awarded to him for leading nonviolent resistance to racial prejudice in the U.S.^[304] In 1965, he was awarded the American Liberties Medallion by the American Jewish Committee for his "exceptional advancement of the principles of human liberty".

Also in 1966, King was elected as a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.^[310] In November 1967 he made a 24-hour trip to the United Kingdom to receive an honorary degree from Newcastle University, being the first African-American to be so honoured by Newcastle.

^[311] In a moving impromptu acceptance speech,^[312] he said There are three urgent and indeed great problems that we face not only in the United States of America but all over the world today. That is the problem of racism, the problem of poverty and the problem of war. Dr. King advocated for



He followed in the footsteps of his grandfather and father by entering the ministry to become a Baptist minister. On April 4, 1968, at the age of 39, he was assassinated in Memphis,

Tennessee as he stood on the balcony of his hotel. Dr. King traveled to Memphis, Tennessee to lead a march in support of striking sanitation workers.








“GOD’S PLAN OF SALVATION”

1 John 5:11-12 And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. The one who has the Son has this eternal life; the one who does not have the Son of God does not have this eternal life.

This passage tells us that God has given us eternal life and this life is in His Son, Jesus Christ. In other words, the way to possess eternal life is to possess God’s Son. The question is, how can a person have the Son of God?

Man’s Problem SEPARATION FROM GOD

Isaiah 59:2 But your sinful acts have alienated you from your God; your sins have caused him to reject you and not listen to your prayers.

Romans 5:8 But God demonstrates his own love for us, in that while

we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

According to Romans 5:8, God demonstrated His love for us through the death of His Son. Why did Christ have to die for us?

Because Scripture declares all men to be sinful. To “sin” means to miss the mark. The Bible declares “all have sinned and fall short of the glory (the perfect holiness) of God” (Rom. 3:23). In other words, our sin separates us from God who is perfect holiness (righteousness and justice) and God must therefore judge sinful man.

Habakkuk 1:13a You are too just to tolerate evil; you are unable to condone wrongdoing.


THE FUTILITY OF OUR WORKS

Scripture also teaches that no amount of human goodness, human works, human morality, or religious activity can gain acceptance with God or get anyone into heaven. The moral man, the religious man, and the immoral and non-religious are all in the same boat. They all fall short of God’s perfect righteousness. After discussing the immoral man, the moral man, and the religious man in Romans 1:18-3:8, the Apostle Paul declares that both Jews and Greeks are under sin, that “there is no one righteous, not even one” (Rom. 3:9-10). Added to this are the declarations of the following verses of Scripture:

Ephesians 2:8-9 For by grace you are saved through faith, and this is not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; 9 it is not of works, so that no one can boast.

Titus 3:5-7 he saved us, not by works of righteousness that we have done but on the basis of his mercy, through the washing of the new birth and the renewing of the Holy Spirit, 6 whom he poured out on us in full measure through Jesus Christ our Savior. 7 And so, since we have been justified by his grace, we become heirs with the confident expectation of eternal life.

Romans 4:1-5 What then shall we say that Abraham, our ancestor according to the flesh, has discovered regarding this matter? 2 For if Abraham was declared righteous by the works of the law, he has something to boast about (but not before God). 3 For what does the scripture say? “Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness.” 4 Now to the one who works, his pay is not credited due to grace but due to obligation. 5 But to the one who does not work, but believes in the one who declares the ungodly righteous, his faith is credited as righteousness.





I can't believe I did such a thing. How could I do such a thing? He said I was going to do it, but I didn't believe him. I just could not have imagined I would ever do such a thing. I am so embarrassed and ashamed. I have made such a fool of myself. How can I ever show my face in public again? What will my friends and companions think of me now? Will they ever accept me back into their fellowship or forgive me? More importantly, will Jesus my Master and best friend ever forgive me?

These were probably some of the thoughts that entered Peter's mind immediately after he denied knowing the Lord on the night Jesus was betrayed and turned over to his enemies. To refresh our memory, when our Lord was betrayed by Judas and turned over to his enemies in the Garden of Gethsemane, the other disciples forsook him and fled. According to Matthew and John's Gospel accounts, Peter had made an effort to defend the Master by cutting off the ear of Malchus, the servant of the high priest. And as our Lord was led away by the mob that had come to arrest him, Peter followed him, but at a distance.

While our Lord was being questioned and tried in the residence of the high priest, Peter was standing outside in the crowd warming himself by the fire when someone accused him of being a follower of Christ. Peter promptly denied knowing Jesus. Later on someone else identified Peter as a disciple of Jesus, and again he promptly denied knowing Jesus. Yet a third time Peter was identified as a follower of Jesus, and for the third time he denied knowing Jesus. According to some accounts Peter cursed and swore that he did not know Jesus. According to Luke's Gospel, at the very moment of his third denial, Jesus turned and looked directly at Peter. Then Peter remembered our Lord's prediction that before the cock crowed that very day Peter would three times deny knowing the Lord. Then Peter immediately went off by himself and wept bitterly.

I would imagine that the night of his denial of Jesus was the worst and loneliest night that Peter ever spent in his life. He had before made a number of blunders and had embarrassed himself on any number of occasions. Even a casual reading of the Gospels reveals Peter's inclination to have foot-in-mouth disease. However, all his efforts, faults, and failures notwithstanding, his denial of Jesus was by far his most grievous, embarrassing, and shameful act.

During the course of our lives we all make a number of mistakes, any one of which could wreak havoc with our lives and our

faith. There are sins that stand out as the most embarrassing and shameful that, more than all the others, have the potential to wreck our faith, our lives, our careers, our families, our marriages, and our relationships. Some wounds cut more deeply than others. Some exposures cause more embarrassment than others do. Some things, if they were

Don't Let Anything Stop Your Growth

Scripture References: St. Mark 16:1-7; St. Luke 24:28-35)

to come to the light of day, would cause more shame than others would. Some things seem almost unforgivable and unrecoverable in the sight of others if they were ever discovered.

How do you continue to hold your head up and continue to function as a husband, wife, friend, father, mother, sister, brother, minister, Pastor, teacher, doctor, lawyer, social worker, professional, or president when you hand has been caught in the "cookie jar" and everybody knows it? How do you continue to look people in the eye when your business is out in the street and everybody knows it? How do you relate to people knowing that they know some of your private failures but not knowing what they are thinking when they are looking at you in the eye? When the truth gets out and you cannot deny it any longer, how do you look at people in the face when you know and they know that you have betrayed their trust in you? What do you do when you feel lower than low? That was the reality Peter faced on the night in which he denied knowing the Lord.

Perhaps that was why Peter received his own personal invitation to behold his risen Lord in Mark's Gospel of the message that the angels delivered to the women who went to the tomb to anoint the body of the Lord on that first Sunday after the Lord's crucifixion. According to the text, the angels told the women to "go, tell

his disciples and Peter that (Jesus) is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." Peter's pain and shame were so deep – and God was so loving and forgiving – that the angels called his name specifically to let him know that he was forgiven, and that Jesus still loved him. SALMON CROQUETTES

INGREDIENTS

1 large can salmon
2 tsp. cornstarch
2 potatoes, boiled
½ tsp. black pepper
½ c onions, chopped

½ tsp. salt
½ bell pepper
5 tsp. yellow corn meal
1 egg

Combine all ingredients together; roll in corn meal as much as desired. Make into patties and cook until brown and crispy.



HAZELNUT-CRUSHED CATFISH

INGREDIENTS

6 (6 oz.) catfish fillets
1 c. fine bread crumbs
1 c. finely chopped hazelnuts
1 c. grated parmesan cheese
½ c. chopped fresh parsley

1 tsp. dried oregano
1 ½ tsp salt
½ tsp black pepper
1 egg lightly beaten

Pre-heat oven to 450°. Lightly grease a baking sheet. Rinse catfish fillets and pat dry. Combine bread crumbs, hazelnuts, cheese, parsley, oregano, salt and pepper. Pour beaten egg into another dish. Dip fillets in egg, then in hazelnut mixture. Coating both sides thoroughly, place fillets on baking sheet. Bake for 15 to 20.

INGREDIENTS

1 can (6½ oz) tuna drained
1 c. (16 oz) cottage cheese
¾ c. chopped pimento
2 tbsp chopped onion

½ tsp celery salt
½ tsp pepper

In a bowl break tuna into bite-size pieces; add cottage cheese, pimento, breadcrumbs, onion, celery salt and pepper, toss to blend. Spoon evenly into a buttered casserole; top with crushed potato chips and Parmesan cheese. Bake in a pre-heated 350° oven for 30 minutes.





THE HISTORY OF WATCH NIGHT SERVICES



Watch Night Service was rooted in Black religion. On the first Watch Night,

enslaved Blacks gathered to pray, worship, sing, and dance. Blacks could find little solace from ever-present


African Americans gathered, many in secret, to ring in the New Year and await news that the Emancipation Proclamation had taken effect.

The occasion, known as Watch Night or "Freedom's Eve," marks when African Americans across the country watched and waited for the news of freedom. Faith Leaders guide congregants in praise and worship. Bowing in prayer minutes before midnight as they sing out, "Watchman, please tell the hour of the night." The minister replies, "It is three Minutes to Midnight...It's one minute before New Year. It's now midnight. Freedom has come!"

Today, Watch Night is an annual New Year's Eve tradition that includes the memory of slavery and freedom, reflections on faith, and celebration of community and strength. Watch Night Service begins around 7pm on 12-31 and it lasts through Midnight. (National Museum of African American History and Culture)

surveillance, even in practicing their faith. Free or enslaved Blacks sought to exercise their religious customs, including Christianity.

On September 22, 1862, President Abraham Lincoln issued the executive order that declared enslaved people in the rebelling Confederate States legally free. However, the decree would not take effect until the clock struck midnight at the start of the New Year. On the night of December 31, 1862, enslaved and free
